Cey Adams, a New York City native, emerged from the downtown graffiti movement to exhibit alongside fellow artists Jean-Michel Basquiat and Keith Haring. He appeared in the historic 1982 PBS documentary Style Wars which tracks subway graffiti in New York. As the Creative Director of hip hop mogul Russell Simmons' Def Jam Recordings, he co-founded the Drawing Board, the label's in-house visual design firm, where he created visual identities, album covers, logos, and advertising campaigns for Run DMC, Beastie Boys, LL Cool J, Public Enemy, Notorious B.I.G., Maroon 5, and Jay-Z.

Cey exhibits, lectures and teaches art workshops at institutions including: MoMA, Brooklyn Museum, Museum of the City of New York, New York University, Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts, Walker Art Center, MoCA Los Angeles, Pratt Institute, Stamford University, Howard University, Atlanta Contemporary Art Center, High Museum, Brooklyn Academy of Music, and Mount Royal University and The University of Winnipeg in Canada.

He co-authored DEFinition: The Art and Design of Hip -Hop, published by Harper-Collins; and designed Def Jam Recordings:

The First 25 Years of the Last Great Record Label, published by Rizzoli. Cey's work explores the relationship between transformation and discovery. His practice involves dismantling various imagery and paper elements to build multiple layers of color, texture, shadow, and light. Cey draws inspiration from 60's pop art, sign painting, comic books, and popular culture. His work focuses on themes including pop culture, race and gender relations, cultural and community issues. Cey currently has an exhibit at the High Museum on the Sneaker Culture.

Gary Young—Director Of Airport Affairs, City of College Park



Currently serves as 'Director of Airport Affairs' and 'Economic Development Project Manager' for the City of College Park, Georgia. Approximately ¼ of Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (HJIA – ATL)is in the City Limits of the City of College Park. HJIA is controlled by the City of Atlanta's Department of Aviation. Liaison between the City Council of College Park, the staff of HJIA, and the City of Atlanta Department of Aviation.

facts

- **SERVICE** We have served nearly 5,000 patrons per year through our website & with person to person events. We provide daily classes year round. Nearly 200 enrolled have participated in outreach since the founding of the Academy in 2005. **Academy students are taught servanthood to the community.**
- EDUCATION Currently we have 9 students enrolled at (Atlanta & Savannah) SCAD Savannah College of Art & Design. In 2016 High school graduation rate is 100%. This percentage is based off the 200 Academy students who have been enrolled in the program for 1 year or more. Of those enrollees 98.5% of the graduating Academy students then go on towards college. Many of our students have gone on to successful artistic careers. The Academy has an intense community leadership based program.
- **ENROLLMENT** The Academy rolls average 20 students, including specialized teams (current & alumni) in 2-d & 3-d animation teams, mobile phone & game applications as well as a mobile mural team called AMAPS
- WORLD WIDE RELEASE In 2010 we released an I-Phone / Apple Digital Comic called Rare Jewels available on ITunes.
- **DEMOGRAPHICS** The average age of an Academy student is 12 years old, and comes from a middle to lower income family. **In 2015-16 The Academy partnered with McNair Middle School** serving 100 at risk students.
- **COSTS** The Average cost per student ratio is over \$800 per month, per student. Tuition only covers about 15% of the operating costs of the school. The Academy relies on grants and donations to operate.
- COMPETITIONS | AWARDS Academy students honored by City Hall for 2016 City of College Park Calendar. Winner of the 2014 MLK Community Service Award from Emory University & Rollins School of Public Health.

 Academy Students placed 1st in a nationwide competition at Semantic Seed Startup Camp @ GA Tech in 2012 competing against IT adults.
- SIGNATURE EVENTS DOS Day of Superheroes—DOS is a celebration of art heroes in us all. AMArvelDay.com is a City wide event created by the Academy which collides comic culture and community.
- **LEADERSHIP SCHOOL** In 2008 the Academy founded the IAS Integrity Above Skill Leadership Academy to address the need for youth leadership.
- MURALS The Academy has created multiple murals from 15 feet long and the largest is over 300 feet long.
